This phase starts from the moment when we were first time told about the Erasmus program and after the language test. The city has a good transportation system hence making the life very easy. The city has a lot to offer for the free time and weekends. There were different local and national festivals also like Easter day, Polish National Day, etc. The city also has lot of traditional restaurant. Apart from the happenings in city, the Erasmus Student Network also organizes many trips, picnics, events and parties for the Erasmus students.
