## **Organisational Support**

These costs are directly related to the implementation of volunteer activities and to the participants' subsistence expenses (e.g. costs of food, accommodation, and transport). They are set as daily rates per participant and listed in the table below:

#### OTHER POSSIBLE FORMS OF SUPPORT UNDER THE EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY CORPS

## **Linguistic support:**

This rate is applicable only for languages and/or levels not offered by the Online Language Support: EUR 150 per participant.

## **Preparatory Visit**

Costs linked to the implementation of the preparatory visit including travel and subsistence. Contribution on the basis of unit costs. EUR 609 per participant for the preparatory visit. Based on the number of participants, including accompanying persons. A maximum of 2 participants per participating organisation can be funded per activity, provided that one of them is a young person with fewer opportunities who will take part in the volunteering activity.

# **Exceptional Costs**

#### 100% of eligible costs:

- Visa costs and costs associated with obtaining a visa, residence permits, vaccinations, medical certificates, costs of meeting security clearance requirements.
- Costs related to personal insurance during in-country activities.
- Reinforced mentorship, i.e. the preparation, implementation and follow up of tailor made activities. Applicants must justify that the standard funding rules ("Inclusion support" unit cost per day per participant) do not cover at least 80 % of the costs incurred. If a grant is awarded, the extraordinary costs associated with supporting the participation of young people with fewer opportunities will replace the grant for social inclusion support.
- Costs incurred by organisations to support the participation of young people with fewer opportunities on equal terms as others related to reasonable adjustments or investment in physical assets.

#### 80% of eligible costs:

- Costs for providing a financial guarantee, if the National Agency asks for it (80 % of eligible costs).
- Expensive travel costs for participants (e.g. from and to outermost regions), including for the use of cleaner, lower carbon emission means of transport which result in expensive travel costs (80 % of eligible costs). Applicants must justify that the standard funding rules (based on unit costs per travel distance band) do not cover at least 70 % of the travel costs of participants. If awarded, the exceptional costs for expensive travel replace the standard travel grant.
