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Information from the Data Controller regarding the processing of personal data for the purposes of recruitment and participation in the project **“Across – Transgraniczny Uniwersytet Europejski** under the NAWA Programme – **Wsparcie Uniwersytetów Europejskich** - pursuant to Article 13(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (hereinafter referred to as the GDPR)

2. In accordance with Article 37(1)(a) of the GDPR, the Controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer (DPO), who may be contacted via e-mail at: iod@pb.edu.pl.
3. Your personal data will be processed for the purpose of conducting recruitment and participation in the project **“Across Transgraniczny Uniwersytet Europejski”** under the NAWA Programme – **Wsparcie Uniwersytetów Europejskich**, based on Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR (processing necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest).
4. The recipients of your personal data may include entities to which the data must be disclosed under the provisions of applicable law.
5. Your personal data will be stored for the period necessary to achieve the above-mentioned purposes, as well as for the period required by law with regard to data archiving.
6. You have the right to access your personal data, and—subject to the provisions of applicable law—you also have the right to:
 - a. rectify (correct) your data;
 - b. erase your data;
 - c. restrict the processing of your data;
 - d. transfer your data;
 - e. object to the processing of your personal data.
7. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority — the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (PUODO) — if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates applicable data protection regulations.
8. Providing your personal data is voluntary, however, it is necessary to participate in the workshops. Failure to provide your data will result in the inability to participate in the recruitment process for the workshops.
9. Your personal data will not be used for automated decision-making or profiling as referred to in Article 22 of the GDPR.
