

Appendix 1 to the Agreement

Information from the Controller regarding data processing – pursuant to Article 13(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (hereinafter referred to as the GDPR)

1. The controller of your personal data is Białystok University of Technology, ul. Wiejska 45A, 15-351 Białystok (hereinafter referred to as the University), tel.: 85 746 90 00, www.pb.edu.pl, e-mail: rektorat@pb.edu.pl;
2. The administrator, in accordance with Article 37(1)(a) of the GDPR, has appointed a Data Protection Officer, whom you can contact in matters related to the processing of personal data by e-mail at: iod@pb.edu.pl.
3. Your personal data will be processed for the purpose of:
 - a. participating in a project implemented by Białystok University of Technology entitled: Biometrics and Artificial Intelligence: Security and Modern Challenges,
 - b. concluding and performing a contract in connection with the implementation of the project – pursuant to Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR,
 - c. fulfilling the legal obligations incumbent on the controller in connection with the implementation of the project – pursuant to the provisions of law regulating these issues – Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR.
4. The recipients of your personal data may be NAWA, NCBiR, the Minister responsible for Regional Development, the controller's internet service providers, postal and courier service providers, the controller's legal staff and other entities authorised under the provisions of law.
5. Your personal data will be stored for the periods necessary to achieve the above-mentioned purposes and for the period resulting from the provisions of law on archiving.
6. You have the right to access your data and, subject to the provisions of law, you have the right to:
 - a. rectify your data,
 - b. delete your data,
 - c. restrict the processing of your data,
 - d. transfer your data,
 - e. object to the processing of personal data
7. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority – the President of the Personal Data Protection Office – if you believe that the processing of personal data violates generally applicable regulations in this area.
8. Providing data is voluntary, but necessary in order to participate in the project. Failure to provide data will result in the inability to conclude and perform a contract in connection with the implementation of the project.
9. Personal data will not be used for automated decision-making or profiling referred to in Article 22.
