 - debt collection and/or claim recovery as a legitimate interest of the Administrator pursuant to Article 6 (1) (f) GDPR;
- 3. Your personal data may be made available to banks, postal and courier service providers, entities providing services to the University, e.g. Internet service providers, legal services and other entities authorised by law.
- 4. Your personal data will be stored during the period of time provided for in the regulations of the law on archiving.
- 5. You have the right to access your data, receive copies of your data, and, within the regulations of the law, to:
